Fundraising

The Kilimanjaro/Safari Benefit Expedition is a climb up Mount Kilimanjaro and an African safari designed to provide a unique opportunity for people like you to combine your active outdoor interests and your generous spirit. By participating, you will raise money to fund “the real work of peace and justice” by supporting education and women’s promotions programs run by the Religious Teachers Filippini.



The Religious Teachers Filippini – The Sisters of the Religious Teachers work to promote the dignity of women and children in some of the poorest countries in the world – and here at home – by providing an education to those who previously had limited opportunities and choices in their lives. Their motto to “Go and Teach” extends even further than education by providing the necessities of life: water, food, shelter, and clothing.



The Institute of the Religious Teachers Filippini was founded by Lucy Filippini and Cardinal Mark Anthony Barbarigo who, in 1692, founded schools to promote the dignity of womanhood and help influence a healthy family life. Today the Sisters continue Saint Lucy’s mission of teaching reading and writing to the poor and empowering women through education.

It was Saint Lucy’s wish to “be present in every corner of the earth.” By joining the benefit expedition, you can help Marshall carry Saint Lucy’s message to the Roof of Africa!

Kilimanjaro/Safari Benefit Expedition

Kilimanjaro

At 19,340 feet high, Mount Kilimanjaro is **The Roof of Africa!**



As a member of the expedition you will climb Kilimanjaro by the Machame route, one of the most scenic routes on the mountain. The climb will take 7 days to ensure that all climbers have a chance to acclimate, greatly increasing the summit success rate. You will carry only a day pack; porters will carry all group gear.

All permits, guides, porters, ground transportation, tents, and meals are included.

African Safari

After climbing Kilimanjaro, join us on a 4 day/ 3 night safari. The safari will include game drives in Lake Manyara National Park, the Serengeti, and Ngorongoro Crater. This is a camping safari at established campgrounds.

All ground transportation, drivers/guides, park entrance fees, tents, and meals are included.



Base of Operations: Moshi



While in Moshi, you'll stay at the Springlands Hotel. The rooms have twin beds, mosquito netting, and bathrooms with hot showers. The hotel is fenced in for security, so you can enjoy the outdoors in the cool African evenings.

Six nights lodging, including breakfast and dinner, at Springlands Hotel are included

Non-Climbing Tour Option

If you'd like to join the group but don't want to climb Kilimanjaro, we have a tour option for you. While the group is on the mountain, you can do a 5 day/ 4 night excursion to Pangani. Then, go on a day trip to Lake Challa and a day trip to Marangu Falls. Then, rejoin the group for the 4 day/3 night safari. This option is available at the same fundraising level as the climb.



Optional Zanzibar Extension

Want to do even more than climb (or tour) and go on safari? Join us for the optional 4 day/3 night Zanzibar extension. Said to be the best-kept secret in the Indian Ocean, with its fascinating historical Stone Town and magnificent beaches, Zanzibar is also known for its incredible diving.

We'll fly you from Kilimanjaro airport to Zanzibar, where you'll stay at Matemwe Beach Village. There's a five-star PADI-affiliated dive operation on-site with excellent diving facilities and well-qualified staff.



There's also plenty to keep non-divers occupied. Relax on the beach, take a cruise in a dhow, snorkel, go fishing, bicycle, or wander about the local village. Known as the Spice Island, you can also tour one of the private plantations. Or, catch a shuttle back into Stone Town, the old city and cultural heart of Zanzibar.

Roundtrip airfare (Kilimanjaro airport to Zanzibar); three nights lodging, including breakfast and dinner; and all airport transfers are included.
